\*A 2.0 cumulative GPA is required for admission to BGSU. The BSBA program requires a minimum of 2.5 GPA and a letter grade of C or better in Business Calculus (Math 1260). If applicants do not meet the minimum requirements, they are advised to continue at CSTCC or take courses at BGSU to complete requirements for admission to the online BSBA program.

\*\*ACCT2210, ACCT2220, ECON2020, ECON2030, STAT2110 & STAT2120 can be taken CSTCC or face-to-face at BGSU to fulfill prerequisite requirements. See p. 4 for Cincinnati State-BGSU equivalencies for these courses.

## II. University Requirements

Each student enrolled in a baccalaureate program must satisfactorily complete GSW 1120 Academic Writing, one course approved for Cultural Diversity in the US, and one course approved for International Perspective.\*\*

## III. General Education (BG Perspective) Equivalencies (effective Fall 2015)

All students must meet BGSU's university, general education, college, and program specific degree requirements effective at the time the student enters the program. All candidates for a baccalaureate degree at BGSU must take at least **36 credit hours** from the BG Perspective curriculum, distributed as follows:

- At least one course in the English Composition and Oral Communication domain
- At least one course in Quantitative Literacy
- At least two courses in each of the following three domains: Humanities and the Arts, Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Natural Sciences
- Additional courses from any of the five domains listed above to reach a minimum of **36 credit hours**
