

**GENERAL ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
WRIGHT STATE UNIVERSITY
AND
CINCINNATI STATE TECHNICAL & COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

In principle, academic credit earned at Cincinnati State Technical and Community College should be transferable to any other accredited institution of higher education. In accordance with this principle, Cincinnati State Technical & Community College and Wright State University agree to mutual cooperation in correlating their respective programs for the Associate and the Baccalaureate degrees. Firm arrangements among institutions of higher education protect students and provide them the opportunity of planning a total baccalaureate degree program at the outset of their college education.

Subject to the terms of this agreement, the students who have earned an Associate's degree at Cincinnati State are assured admission to Wright State University with junior-level standing for courses of study completed at Cincinnati State Technical and Community College. Students who complete the Ohio Transfer Module will be considered to have met the requirements of the Wright State Core, Wright State's general education program; however, students must complete any Wright State Core courses required by their major, by completing either an equivalent course at Cincinnati State or the course itself at Wright State. To facilitate transfer of students and to provide them with accurate transfer information at the earliest possible time, articulated programs between Wright State University departments and Cincinnati State Technical and Community College academic units will be developed after this agreement is approved by the cooperating institutions.

PRINCIPLES OF AGREEMENT

Cincinnati State and Wright State University confirm the following points of agreement, to assure equal treatment of all transfer and regularly enrolled students:

1. The determination of major program requirements for a Baccalaureate degree shall be the responsibility of authorized representatives of Wright State University.
2. For admission to Wright State University, the student will be required to earn at least a 2.0 overall average on a four point scale. The same criteria required of students for admission to programs having prerequisites other than a 2.0 grade average, will be applicable to Cincinnati State Technical and Community College students. All Cincinnati State coursework intended for transfer must have earned grades of D or better.

3. No time limit (years) shall be placed on the acceptance of credit transferable from Cincinnati State Technical & Community College to Wright State University except when there is a specific policy of limitations for matriculated students at Wright State University.
4. If limitations on enrollment become necessary in an upper level division Wright State University program, the University will provide Cincinnati State Technical & Community College with admission criteria and probable enrollment limitations. Cincinnati State Technical & Community College students will be treated equally with matriculated WSU students for admission into programs with enrollment limitations.
5. If requested by either Cincinnati State Technical and Community College or Wright State University and approved by the students involved, transcripts of the transfer students from Cincinnati State Technical and Community College will be transmitted and shared between both institutions for the purpose of providing counseling of prospective transfer students and providing follow-up information for Cincinnati State Technical regarding success of students transferring to Wright State University.
6. Cincinnati State Technical and Community College students transferring to Wright State University will be treated the same as matriculated Wright State University students of equal class standing when applying for financial aid and in the award and distribution of these funds.
7. Cincinnati State Technical and Community College students transferring to Wright State University will receive consideration for campus housing on the same basis as Wright State University students of equal class standing.
8. Cincinnati State Technical and Community College students transferring to Wright State University will receive equal opportunity to pre-register for junior level classes and have access to other student services on the same basis as matriculated Wright State University students of equal class standing.
9. Cincinnati State Technical & Community College and Wright State University will assign a staff member to serve as a liaison to assure maintenance of communication between the institutions.

10. Reaching Students

a. Mutual Marketing Efforts

- i. Cincinnati State will appropriately include this agreement in any listing of articulation and transfer agreements and will communicate this information through a web portal designed to disseminate transfer information to students, staff, and faculty. Other methods of communication, when appropriate, might include and are not limited to inclusion in the college catalog, program specific materials, and graduate mailings.
- ii. Wright State will appropriately include this agreement in any listing of articulation and transfer agreements and will communicate this information, and afford the appropriate training when necessary, to staff and faculty to support the Cincinnati State transfer student.

b. Mutual Use of Tradenames, Trademarks & Logos

- i. Cincinnati State is hereby granted a limited, non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use Wright State University's tradenames, trademarks, and logos during the term of this Agreement for the sole purpose of promoting this Agreement and Wright State University's and Cincinnati State's programs in accordance with this Agreement.
- ii. Wright State University is hereby granted a limited, non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use Cincinnati State's name, tradenames, trademarks, and logos during the term of this Agreement for the sole purpose of marketing to the Cincinnati State student population about this Agreement and Wright State University's and Cincinnati State's programs in accordance with this Agreement.
- iii. Upon termination of this Agreement, the limited licenses set forth in this section will immediately terminate and each party shall (i) cease all such aforementioned use; and (ii) discard, destroy or delete any printed and electronic materials containing the name, tradename, trademark, or logo of the other party. Neither party shall use the name, tradename, logo, or trademark of the other party in any way that would cause confusion in the public mind as to the relationship between the parties, and, except for the limited license set forth in this section, neither party shall by virtue of this Agreement gain any right, title, or interest in any name, tradename, trademark, or logo of the other party.
- iv. Neither party may assign or transfer its rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. In no event, shall the license or use of Wright State University's or Cincinnati State's name, tradename, trademark, or logo be assigned to a parent, affiliate, or successor company formed by the merger or reorganization or similar

corporate transaction of Wright State University or Cincinnati State with any other company.


11. Either party may initiate the termination of this Agreement upon six months written notification to the other party. Students in progress will be permitted to complete the program. Review of this agreement should be initiated every four academic years.






