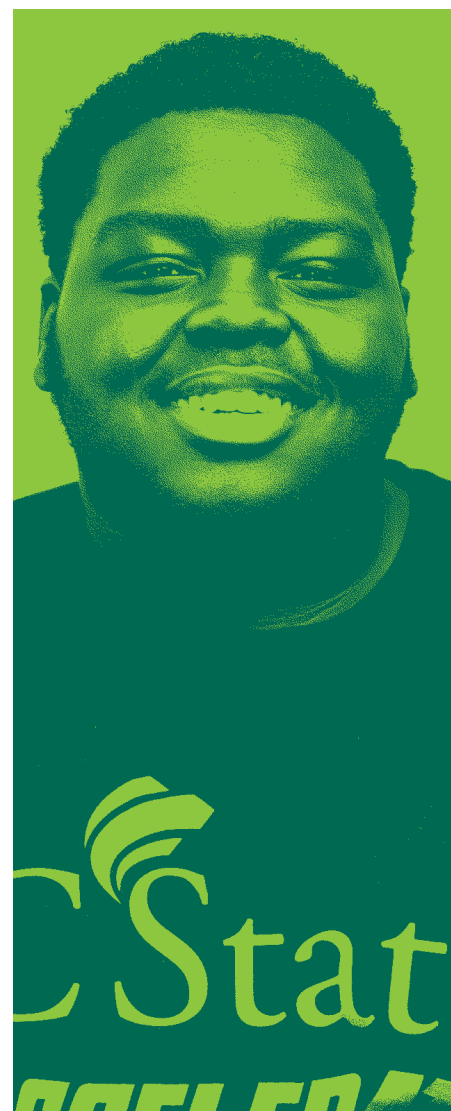

Admissions Checklist

Step 1. Apply

- ☐ Visit apply.cincinnati.state.edu
Once you have started an application, you can log back into your account at any time to complete it and track the status of your application.

Step 2. Request Official Documents

- ☐ High School Transcript or GED Test Scores
- ☐ College Transcripts (if college courses have been completed)

Official documents must be sent directly from the school electronically or by mail. Students may order transcripts online through their school's website using Naviance, Parchment, or the National Student Clearinghouse, for example, or the school may forward official documents via email to adm@cincinnati.state.edu, fax (513) 569-1562 or mail to:

Step 3. Check for updates

- ☐ Your admission letter will be emailed to you so check your email regularly.

Optional: Test Scores

Standardized test scores are not required for admission but they can help with advising. If you have taken the ACT or SAT within the past two years, we encourage you to request that your scores be included in your high school transcript or sent directly from the testing agency. Our ACT code is 5570 and our SAT code is 1984.
